Grant Writing

Tips for staff of Olentangy Schools applying for an OEF Grant



Grant Guidelines

- Directly impact Olentangy students
 - The more students it impacts, the better
 - This can be directly or indirectly, make sure you specify all types of impact.
- Be used to purchase tangible items.
- Funds may be used to compensate outside consultants, speakers, etc. who work with students or parents, but may <u>not</u> be used to compensate Olentangy Employees.



Grant Guidelines

- Grant items must remain in the designated school building with the corresponding program unless the *program* moves to another Olentangy Schools building.
- Be approved by the faculty member's principal or supervisor.
- Be implemented in the specific school year for which the application is submitted.
- Have any proposed changes approved by OEF prior to the project's implementation.
- Be self-sustainable after the initial OEF grant. (Please make sure to provide details to your overall plan!)
- Awarded grants must be purchased and implemented within the granted school year



The Olentangy Education Foundation typically does <u>not</u> fund:

- Materials or programs that are included in an Olentangy Schools budget
- Travel expenses
- Classroom furniture This includes alternative furniture that may be funded by the district, and/or individual school grants/funds.
- Programs or materials unable to sustain themselves after the initial grant. Please make sure to provide details of your long term plan.
- Field trips (except student registrations), disposable items, or conferences and seminars.



Selection Criteria (Completed Application Requirements)

- The application:
 - includes research data that supports the project or origin idea.
 - includes clearly defined methods and tools that will be used to measure the desired results.
 - shows consideration has been given to multiple funding sources.
 - has qualifications or training to use the grant funds as intended.



Project Selection Criteria

- The project:
 - provides a description of how the project is creative, innovative and extends beyond the average classroom/school experience.
 - affects many students and/or teachers. A project may indirectly impact a larger number of students and/or the school community. Make sure to explain who and how your project impacts those students.
 - is sustainable after the initial grant.
 - directly relates to the strategic plan and/or the district benchmarks.
 - promotes collaboration between teachers/grades and programs.



Recommendations when completing the application

- Verify with Olentangy School's Technology Department to confirm electronics and programs are compatible and approved prior to submitting your application.
 - Also, verify with technology department what the replacement or damage plan for items' purchased would be. Please provide this information in your application.
- If you are requesting books, please have cost quote from Barnes and Noble or Bean Bag Books.
- If you are ordering an Apple product please have cost quote from Apple for most consistent pricing.
- All items purchased should be tax free, verify if there is a tax exemption.
- Provide details of why your grant is innovative, creative and what makes your grant special.




Examples of Prior Grants



The Water Project



- OEF Board Approval June 4th, 2024
- OLSD Board Approval June 2024
- Notification to Applicants July 2024
- Purchase Orders due to Central Office Early August
